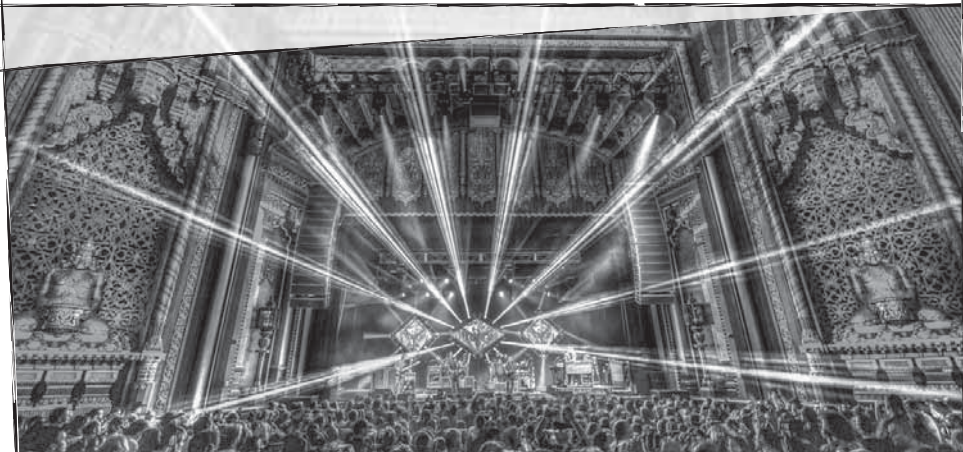

FALL INCIDENTS PREVIEW

Hello East Coast! It's been a while, but The String Cheese Incident is finally returning to the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast for a two week run of Incidents! SCI will be coming in hot from Florida, after three full shows at Suwannee Hulaween, and the band is stoked to get back on the bus for a full-fledged tour up the East Coast!

Up first is two nights at the historic Lincoln Theater in Washington, DC. This is essentially a hometown show for Kyle Hollingsworth, who grew up in nearby Baltimore, Maryland and attended Towson University. SCI then heads to The Foxwoods Casino in Ledyard, Connecticut. It's been a whopping eight years since SCI last played Connecticut, so be sure to give them a warm welcome back! The band then jumps over to Philadelphia for a Friday night show at the Tower Theatre in Upper Darby before making their first ever trip to the Starland Ballroom in Sayreville, New Jersey.

After a quick day off, the Barefoot Boys will travel to Bill Nershi's old stomping grounds in upstate New York for an intimate Incident at the historic State Theatre in Ithaca (where they haven't played since 2005). The tour bus will then set its sights on NYC area, where SCI will play two nights at The Capitol Theater in Port Chester, New York (another first time venue for the band)! This beautiful room will be the perfect setting for back-to-back Incidents. SCI will continue north, to New England, for a two night run at the State Theatre in Portland, Maine (another state and venue the band hasn't played since 2005). Finally, the Fall Incidents tour will end with a bang at the legendary Memorial Auditorium in Burlington, Vermont (a full 11 years since the last Incident in Burlington)!

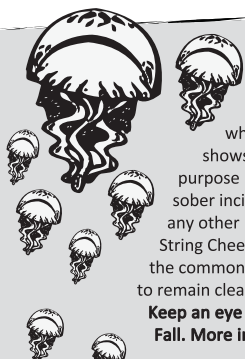

Please make note that taping is only allowed in designated taping areas (usually located behind the soundboard). Space in the tap-section is limited and access policies vary from venue to venue. In most cases, the venue will provide the necessary equipment for recording. If you are bringing your own recording equipment into the venue, there may be a charge for the use of the venue's equipment. Taping is not allowed in the tap-section in the case that the venue is entirely general admission, or that the floor is general admission, tapers are allowed into the venue on a first come, first serve basis. When the section is fully, no additional recording equipment will be allowed into the show. Sorry, but anyone found taping in violation of the above policy will be removed from the venue.
